






How often did you attend St. Luke Sunday worship when we gathered in the sanctuary, on average?




How often do you attend St. Luke Sunday worship on Zoom, on average? 57 responses




Do you attend St. Luke programs outside Sunday worship, such as Bible Study or Men's Group (during COVID and/or non-COVID times)?









Have you participated in St. Luke committees in the past? 57 responses




If your participation in St. Luke programs and committees has increased in the past two years, please check all that apply.




If your participation in St. Luke programs and committees has decreased in the past two years, please check all that apply.




If your participation at St. Luke Sunday worship has increased in frequency since we have worshipped on Zoom, please check all that apply.




If your participation in St. Luke Sunday worship has decreased in frequency since we have worshipped on Zoom, please check all that apply.




How many invitations have you extended to family and/or friends to visit St. Luke for worship or other programs over the past year?




What keeps you coming back to St. Luke? Please check all that apply.




How often do you engage in devotional activities on your own, such as prayer/meditation, Bible reading, or hymn singing, alone or with your family and/or friends?


Do you attend spiritual programs, such as regular Bible study or meditation retreats, sponsored by organizations other than St. Luke?




How do you feel about St. Luke worship services overall? 58 responses



How do you feel about the music offered during St. Luke worship services? 58 responses




How do you feel about the sermons preached during St. Luke worship services? 58 responses














When we meet in person for worship, do you stay after for coffee fellowship?








We welcome everyone to full participation in our worship and programs, regardless of personal characteristics, status, or situation.




We listen to one another, learn from one another, and honor one another's lives as we journey together through life.


Worship: We praise. We praise God. We praise with thanksgiving all we are given: the good, the bad, the ugly, and the glorious as all God given.




In worship we come together to hear the Word and value the limitless relevance to our world today through the universal struggles of a people then and a people today.




Family: We refer to the people of the church as family because we value what family provides. We embrace the reality that no family is perfect, but looks to love one another in times of need and in times of celebration.






Ministry and service is the doing of our faith.







Overall, how do you feel about the Christian theology and values expressed through worship and programs at St. Luke?






- Gratitude for the way our children have been treated by the St Luke community.






Worship services that incorporate liturgies from a variety of styles, eras, and traditions.




# Worship services that are intellectually stimulating.




# Worship services that offer parts especially for children.




# Christian education for adults, including weekly Bible study.




# Christian education for children and youth.






- · Intelligence and humor


- III. How do you view St. Luke's programs, ministry/outreach and future?

Community: St. Luke will be a community where people connect. St. Luke will provide a place where human connection can flourish in worship, fellowship, and service.










Those who are shut in and alone will be brought to worship God.


Overall, how do you feel about St. Luke's current level of ministry/outreach to our local community? 56 responses





